

### ***Shared Internet Access***

RideWay is a simple, cost-effective software program that lets multiple users access the Internet using one modem (or digital connection), one phone line, and one Internet account -- **all at the same time.**

RideWay runs on a single Win95 or WinNT computer. This PC connects to your Internet Service Provider using the standard Microsoft Dial-Up Networking system that you now use. No special hardware or software is required for the other LAN computers to share the "RideWay" computer's Internet connection.

All Win95, WinNT, Win3.x, and Macintosh computers on your network will be able to concurrently access the Internet through the single RideWay computer.

Your Internet Service Provider (ISP) supports RideWay—guaranteed. And you don't have to purchase separate ISP accounts for each user.

RideWay is successfully implemented in corporate, branch, and home offices. Setup requires just a few minutes and can be done by anyone.

RideWay works with Novell NetWare, Windows NT, and Windows 95 networks. We strongly recommend it for workgroups who want Internet access but don't want to spend a lot of money.

### ***Anti-Virus Leader Pushes Software***

Beginning in 1998, McAfee will use its Enterprise SecureCast to push all upgrades directly to its corporate customers. McAfee's Enterprise SecureCast is for current owners of a corporate McAfee Software License.

Network administrators can now focus on other duties while McAfee software upgrades are automatically sent. Automatic updates will also include Virus Signature Updates (DAT files).

### ***Novell Servers Won't Ring In The New Year***

Novell NetWare 3.12 and 4.1 are not year-2000 compliant based on the standard installation.

Novell has beta-versions of upgrade patches that allow these best-selling local area networking products to work beyond December 31, 1999; however, installing the upgrades on client workstations can require reconfiguring individual workstations.

Even while some workstations may be Year 2000 (Y2K) compliant, many offices still use computers that require a hardware bios upgrade in addition to software configuration.

When NetWare v3.12 and v4.1 servers are set to 12/31/1999 23:59 (11:59 P.M.), using the "Set Time" console command, and then powered off for two minutes, they lose the correct time. When they're turned on after two minutes, they report the time as a few minutes after midnight, January 1, 1988. The date problem also occurs if the server is left running through the date change.

Novell will release permanent patches early in 1998.
